1.0 PREAMBLE

2.0. ACADEMICS

2.1. Teaching and Learning

The teaching and learning process has gone on smoothly. All the planned academic programs were achieved and implemented. All the students did Assessments in different levels to end the term (S.1, S.2, S.3 and S.5) while S.4 and S.6 did Internal Mocks.

2.2. Mock Exams 2025

S.4 and S.6 candidates did Internal Mock Exams and this will be used to issue report cards for this term. External Mock Exam is ongoing for S.4 and S.6 candidates and will end on 21st August 2025.

2.3. Directorate of Industrial Training (DIT)

It is only tailoring and tiling that attracted very few students—that have not started on their practical lessons but new term the school plans to procure some sewing machines. Students under this program will be issued with a special report to show their level of achievement and a list of requirements.

The school registered a remarkable achievement with a total of 159 students admitted for Undergraduate (135) and Diploma (24) programs in Public Universities.08 were admitted for engineering courses on government sponsorship for Bachelors while 20 for Diploma programs.

The UNEB Examinations will start on 10th October, 2025 for UCE (S.4) with briefing and writing papers on 13th October, 2025.


UACE (S.6) on 7th November, 2025 with briefing and writing papers on 10th November, 2025.

3.0 SCHOOL FEES

The school is grateful to a bigger number of parents who met 70% fees payment on reporting day as per the school fees policy and cleared the balance of 30% by Visitation Day. All Parents are all encouraged to honor and abide by the fees policy for the smooth running of school operations.

NOTE:

- (i) The Accounts Department has introduced a fees record pass book issued once to a student for a year, however if a student loses it, replacement will be at a cost of 50.000/=.
- (ii) Students taking Fine Art S.1 S.6 and Foods and Nutrition from S.2 -S.6 are required to pay. Shs.40, 000/= per term.
- (iii) Hostel fee is Shs.700, 000/= per term.
- (iv) Hostel boys will be charged additional six thousand (6,000/=) for hair trimming which is done monthly.
- (v) S.4 hostel boys of term one whose uniform got burnt and the school provided them will be charged accordingly in term III 2025 total of 125,000/=.
- (vi) S.6 candidates are charged 52,000/= for PUJAB/JAB forms.

4.0 KEY EVENTS/ACTIVITIES IN TERM III 2025

This shall be held in term III on a date that shall be communicated.

5.0 BEREAVEMENTS

We extend our heartfelt sympathy and condolences to staff and parents who lost their beloved ones in the course of term one. 6.0 UNIFORMS

6.1 Shoes

We observe with concern that our students wear all-kinds of shoes with our uniform which makes them look untidy. It was resolved that all boys and girls wear black flat soled leather shoes. "Platform" or block heeled shoes are henceforth banned in the school. Students should carry sports shoes to be used during Physical Education lessons or Sports and Games.

6.2 Non-uniform sweaters

These are not allowed in the school. The students who need extra warm clothing should get an extra sleeveless sweater and a scarf from the uniform's Office at school. These can be got at a cost of 50,000/= (Sweater) and 25,000/= (Scarf).

- 6.3 Girls at both O & A Level must wear white stockings. Any other color of stockings is prohibited in the school. Hair: Girls who have grown hair must comb their hair neatly backwards or hold it firmly with a plain black ribbon. It's observed that some girls are abusing the privilege of growing hair and this shall not be accepted.
- 6.4 Boys at 'O' level must wear gray stockings while those at A-level must wear only black socks. Belts: Every student MUST wear the belt that is supplied together with the uniform.

Other kinds of belts are not allowed. **The boys** must trim their hair evenly to 1cm long. Any ostentatious haircuts are prohibited.

7.0 DISCIPLINE

The discipline of our students has been generally good except for a few cases which were promptly resolved. The most violated school rules were Rule No. 22(Mobile Phones and other gadgets) and Rule 4: Punctuality. We note with concern the persistent late coming by some of our students. On average around 30 students arrive late to school. This ultimately affects the academic progress of these learners since the school gates close by 7:30am; a resolution which was passed by parents in the last years' Annual General Meeting. I implore you to ensure that your child arrives to school by 7:00am.

8.0 STUDENTS' ATTENDANCE TRACKING SYSTEM

Kyambogo College School remains a committed community towards nurturing and guiding students for excellent discipline basing on our core values. Many of our students have exhibited positive behaviour with just a few defiant cases whom we have supported to improve. In addition, I encourage you, parents, to continue working with us as we nurture holistic development amongst our children by closely monitoring them and having open communication with the school.

8.1. MEAL CARDS

All students now use the swiping cards to access meals, encourage your child to take school meals. Meals are compulsory for all students and staff.

9.0 GAMES AND SPORTS

- **9.1.** The school actively participates in games and sports in the following sports discipline: Football, Basketball, Rugby, Lacrosse, racket games, handball among others.
- 9.2. The school actively participated in National Secondary School Championship in Tororo in these disciplines; Boys volley ball, Boys basketball 3 x 3 and athletics and it performed well.

10.0. BEGINNING OF TERM III, 2025

Term III, 2025 will begin on Monday 15th September, 2025 and end on Friday 5th December, 2025. However, the hostel students will report on Sunday 14th September, 2025 between 8:00am and 5:00pm. Please abide by the date and time set for the arrival of the hostel students.

Student leaders (Prefects) will report to school **on Saturday 13th September, 2025** morning and will have a meeting with administrators in the same afternoon of that day.

11.0 VISITATION DAYS

Saturday 4th October, 2025 for S.4 candidates with a dedication service from 9:00am. **Saturday 1st November, 2025 S.6** dedication service and visitation for S.1, S.2, S.3 and S.5 All parents are expected to clear the 30% fees balance by visitation day.

12.0 SPIRITUAL MATTERS

12.1. The school held a thanksgiving Academic Award Ceremony for 2024 UCE and UACE performance on 13th June, 2025. This was graced by the main celebrant Rev. Dr. Canon Rebecca Margret Nyegenye and Chief Guest was the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education and Sports Dr. Canon Kedrace Turyagenda.

S. 5	1 mop with wooden handle and 1 litre of Jik(Chlorine Bleach) and a ream of photocopying paper Double A with a dark cover.
S.6	5 litres of liquid soap and 1kg Vim (scouring powder) and a ream of photocopying paper Double A with a dark cover.
ALL CLASSES	- 5 rolls of Toilet tissue (big size), and personal items - a Container with a lid, 1 litre Water Bottle, Plate and Fork. Plastics are discouraged medically.
